

ROTORTRADE SUPPORTS AIR MERCY SERVICE'S FLEET MODERNIZATION

Rotortrade successfully completed two AW119 helicopter transactions supporting the South African Red Cross Air Mercy Service's ongoing modernization program. AMS, a non-profit organization celebrating nearly 60 years of lifesaving service in the emergency medical services sector, continues to expand and upgrade its capabilities while reinforcing its long-standing partnership with Rotortrade. These latest achievements reflect a relationship built on trust, with AMS relying on Rotortrade for fleet renewal, technical project management, and remarketing support.

The two AW119 transactions — involving one AW119 Ke and one AW119 KX — highlight Rotortrade's ability to leverage its global network across Asia, Africa, and Latin America to support mission-critical operators. The first project involved the successful remarketing and placement of an AW119 Ke previously operated by AMS. The process was completed within a short timeframe thanks to seamless coordination between the AMS and Rotortrade teams.

The second project focused on sourcing and preparing an AW119 Kx tailored to AMS's operational requirements. The helicopter completed its technical works, including a hot section inspection with Pratt & Whitney, before being shipped to South Africa and is scheduled to enter EMS service in

Q1 2026.
